

A Brief History of SWI

Social Welfare Institute is a charitable and Social Service Society of the Diocese of Raiganj and its area of operation include Malda, Uttar Dinajpur and Dakshin Dinajpur districts of West Bengal. The Institute was established with the aim of bringing about a society where love, peace and equality are lived and experienced by all.

During the Indo – Pak war in 1971, nearly 2 million refugees from Bangladesh landed up in North Bengal for asylum; government machineries were unable to meet the needs of the refugees. Due to heavy influx of refugees, basic needs such as food, shelter and medical care collapsed. People of North Bengal faced innumerable problems. At once, then diocese of Dumka, feeling the dire needs of the people rushed for help; as a result, Social Welfare Institute came into existence and it is presently in Raiganj diocese.

To begin with, it focused its attention on the welfare of the refugees, then after the war, seeing the poverty stricken lives of the poorest and tribal in the area, it continued its services in order to uplift the downtrodden especially the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. Within two years (1973), Social Welfare Institute was registered under the Societies' Registration Act XXVI of 1961. From then on, it has been carrying out various welfare programmes for the weaker sections of society by the help of several donor agencies. Since 1985 the attention shifted to community based programs, especially through integrated approach at the village level. This gave way for creation of community based groups, organizations and institutions at the village level.

Naya Kiran Project

This project is to get ready 150 drop out children for formal education system. We have 12 tuition centers in Uttar Dinajpur district. This tuition centres play a great roll to teach and update the children so that they can cope with formal education according to the age and class. Beside this we also create awareness on education to parents to mainstream the drop out children into the formal education system.





Objective - To reduce the high school dropout rate in Uttar Dinajpur and the resulting exposure to human trafficking networks, which are very active in this border region.

Livelihood project (TDF-61)

Nabard supported Livelihood project (TDF-61) is to ensure self employment through animal hasbandry to 350 Schedule tribe farmers of 7 villages of Nijampur Gram Panchayat of Goalpokher II block of Uttar Dinajpur district. It improves their standard of living. It helps in developing high yielding breeds of animals through cross breeding. It increases the production of various food products

SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The main objective of this tailoring training program is to enhance the quality of life for women through enhancement of their skills and knowledge. They needed to learn newer vocational skills such as tailoring (sewing) which can help them earn more income and become economically self-sufficient and independent. This will alleviate poverty, help them support their family needs without being dependent of husband and parents. In order to help them, SWI started free tailoring (sewing) training centers in Adiar village of Rampur Gram Panchayat of Raiganj block of U.Dinajpur.



Empowered Communities foster Climate Adaptive Agriculture and Livelihoods

The project significant emphasis on food availability through agriculture and focusing on bridging the gap between community members and government service providers. Different health aspects are given priority in the project specially Mother and Child health, immunization



and food security. The key activities of the project is - interface meetings with govt. departments and Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI) members. It helps the beneficiary to gain knowledge on Govt Schemes and access it.

The project covers three Grampanchayats (Aktoil, Mangalpura and Habibpur) of Habibpur Block of Malda district

GOAL - Marginalized households of 3 gram Panchayat in West Bengal have improved their living Condition through greater Food Sovereignty and increased access to Government resources.

OBJECTIVE 01 - By 2024, 60% target households of 3 GPs in Habibpur block in Maldah district of West Bengal will have increased access to government resources/ schemes and entitlements.





OBJECTIVE 02 - 60% (2064HH of 3440 HH)
Marginal farmers of 3 Gram Panchayat in 1
blocks in West Bengal will have greater food sovereignty by 2024 through adopting 'Climate Adaptive Agriculture Practices (CAAP), optimum water resource management and marketing of produce through organized markets and networks To enhance the health & Nutrition status of women



Major Achievement

- * Gender-based discrimination in the family has been reduced. Girls are given priority on education and nutrition.
- * The dropout rate of girl child has decreased by an average of 10% to 15%.
- * 7% increase household income of communities.
- * 15 bighas of land cultivated mung beans.
- * The rate of migration has decreased

Reclamation of waste land - A story of change

SWI initiated to promote orchard farming. Debasish Ray and Anjali Majhi agreed for orchard farming since it needs less water. We provided 30 saplings of Bharat Sundari jujube plant and other 30 saplings they managed, total 60 saplings they planted in the land. They watered from a nearby pond. After one year they got 5 kilo jujube and sold at Rs. 100-120 prices per kilogram. In 2nd year time they hope to get Rs. 30,000 from 300 kgs of jujubes.



CHILDREN IMMUNIZATION PROGRAMME



Vaccines reduce risks of getting a disease by working with your body's natural defenses to build protection. When a child gets vaccine, the immune system responds. So, Social Welfare Institute operates a self supported immunization centre since 2005. Subsequently it has been rendering services to the people. The camp functions for three days in a week (Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday). Availability and regularity of vaccination has been good service to the people.

Uttoran-III

Uttoran - III project ensures food availability of the targeted household and increase the family income through Climate Adaptive-Agriculture and uses of natural compost, vermin compost and natural pest management. It also emphasizes on animal husbandry and skill development prog. like tailoring, small entrepreneurship. Resource generation through meeting and good linkage with supporting Govt. departments, leveraging NABARD. resources from KVK. The project Uttoran - III covers 25 villages of Rampur and Sitgram Gram Panchayats of Raigani block of Uttar Dinajpur.

CASE STORY - A NEW TYPES OF CULTIVATION

Bikram Baskey is a resident of Sahapur village of Rampur GP of Raiganj block, Uttar Dinajpur. He is a collage student having mother and a brother in the family. He has a small forest behind his house. It was so jungle that snakes and other insects built their nest. During a meeting on climate adoptive agriculture a man raised the issue of snake. So, Community educator Joy Chakraborty suggested Bikram to clean the jungle and plant dragon fruit plant. They brought the sapling from Karandighi block. He planted 30 saplings in 10 pillers fo 8". Dragon fruit are produced twice a year. Within 15 months he got 8 kgs of fruit for first time which he sold @ Rs. 300/- per kg, total he received Rs. 2400/-. And 2nd time dragon fruit has flourished and the dragon plant has nearlly 80 fruits.1 kg contains 4 fruits. So he will receive this season 20 kg x Rs. 300/- = 6000/-. Recently he has started a nursery of dragon fruit plant.





BLOOD DONATION CAMP

"Donating blood is the most valuable gift we can give". Believing the phrase SWI organized a blood donation camp on 25th December 2024 on the occasion of birth anniversary of Lord Jesus Christ. The purpose to organize a blood donation camp is to motivate people to donate blood, So, that increase blood availability. It is to promote and select a suitable donor whose blood will be safe to the recipient. The decision to donate blood can save a life or even several if the blood is separated into its components
